Pastor's Musings: An Ecstatic Epiphany!

Epiphany follows immediately after the 12 days of Christmas. The word *epiphany* means "revelation" or "showing forth" or "manifestation." During Epiphany we observe the manifestation of God in Christ to all the nations of the world. God has appeared. God is revealed to the Wise Men as the child Jesus, and later as an adult when he is baptized, anointed with the Holy Spirit and called God's beloved Son. The Season of Epiphany runs from January 6 to Ash Wednesday, February 17. During Epiphany we reflect upon being children of light.

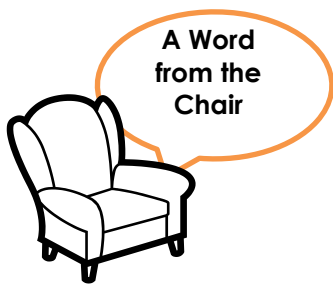
This time in the Church is also about how God's glory is revealed in Christ, and this is particularly so on the final Sunday in Epiphany Season which is always celebrated as the Transfiguration of our Lord. This amazing event is about Jesus' journey to the mountaintop with four of his disciples where he is transfigured before them, revealing again God's glory and his identity as God's Son as it is once more proclaimed from the heavens.

So as we continue on this journey through the Season of Epiphany, what are your "Aha" moments? When do you experience a revelation of God? In the gospel stories, these events typically happen in ordinary settings with ordinary people, not necessarily with religious leaders in a place of worship. I encourage you to continue to be open to God's revelation **to you wherever you are!**

The other thing to note with these revelations of Jesus is that it changes those who experience it. So again, I encourage you to reflect upon how your experiences of God's revelations have changed you. Or maybe consider also how epiphanies for others have transformed their lives.

During this time of pandemic with its constantly changing ways of living and interacting, one thing I am constantly marvelling at is how God continues to reveal God's presence and activity, especially in the simple and ordinary things of life. As 2021 unfolds, even with the unexpected assault on Washington's Capitol Building on the Day of Epiphany, even with the unexpected slowdown of vaccine production, even with the unexpected resignation of Canada's Governor-General, even with....God is at work. God is in control. And God is all about surprising us and revealing God to us. And just maybe, like the Wise Men who were warned in a dream to avoid the dangers of the current political power and returned home by another way, we too may find our ways being changed and having to readjust our plans. But we too will find our way home, as God continues to lead and guide us. I look forward to hearing about your Ecstatic Epiphany Experiences!

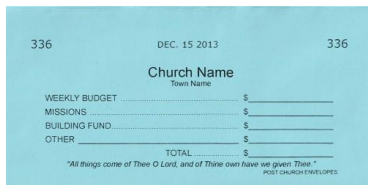

Offering Envelopes 2021



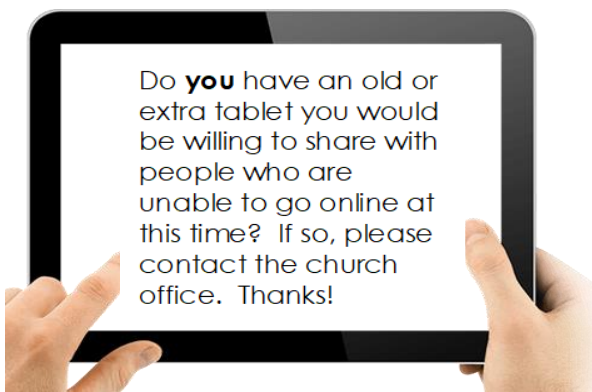
Offering envelopes are ready for 2021. Your envelope number will remain the same as 2020.

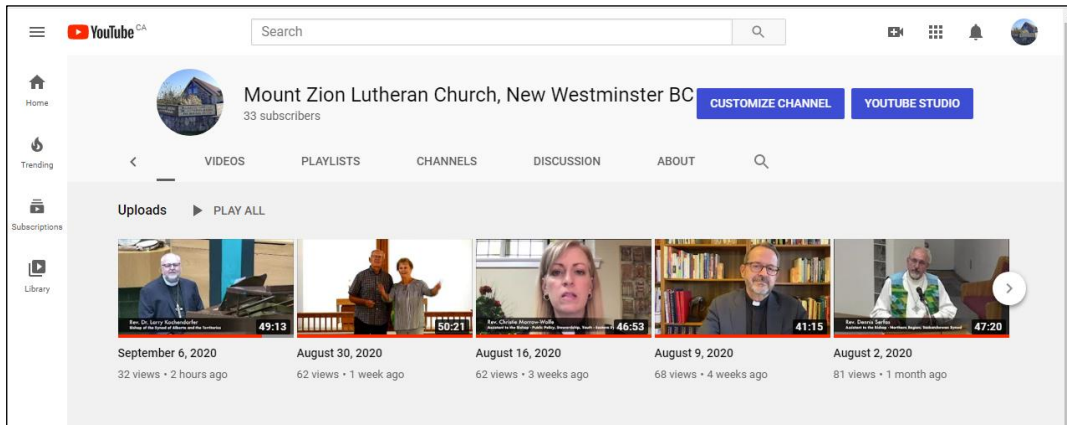

Re: Notice of Annual General Meeting

As per Bylaw 7 (Congregational Meetings), Section 5:

Written notice of all congregational meetings shall be sent to all members and to the rostered minister(s) under call to the congregation at least fourteen (14) days in advance of the date of the meeting. Written notice must be sent:

- a. by mail, unless a member has provided his or her email address to the Congregational Council, in which case written notice must be sent by electronic mail;
- b. by posting the written notice on the congregational website; and
- c. by posting the written notice in a public area within the church building.

Please note the following ministerial order which applies to meetings governed by BC's *Societies Act*

Electronic attendance at corporate meetings

3 (1) Despite anything in a corporate enactment, a person who is entitled to participate in, including vote at, a corporate meeting may do so by telephone or other communications medium if all of the persons participating in the meeting, whether by telephone, by other communications medium or in person, are able to communicate with each other and, if applicable, vote at the meeting.

Voting will be conducted by using the "Raise Your Hand" feature on a Zoom call or by roll calling of those who are participating by telephone.

Notice of Upcoming Annual Meeting Sunday, February 28 at 11:00am via Zoom

We encourage you to sign in or phone in for the Zoom meeting at **10:45am** to provide time for dealing with any technological difficulties☺ You **must** use the phone information below to connect with the meeting. Do **NOT** use Mount Zion's telephone number. For a copy of the annual report to be mailed to you, please contact the church office between **February 15-18**. Digital copies will be emailed in mid-February.

In order to vote and/or be elected to Church Council you must be a member of Mount Zion Lutheran Church. Visitors are welcome to attend and participate in the meeting's discussions.

How to Become a Member at Mount Zion

Have you ever wondered how to become a member at Mount Zion? As defined by our constitution, you become a member in **one of three ways**: *received in baptism; through new membership, or transfer from another congregation.* You remain an active member when you receive communion and contribute through your offerings. That's why we like you to fill out a communion card and use your offering envelopes.

In addition to all the other benefits of being an active member, it also means you are eligible to vote at congregational meetings and to be elected to church council. If people are not actively involved with the congregation for more than two years, then they are moved to a responsibility list, but they do not cease to be a member. The only way to lose your membership status is by death, transfer to another congregation, or by request to be removed from the membership list.

Mount Zion Church Council Team Descriptions

Mount Zion's Church Council operates with an executive and teams. Team leaders are members of church council, but any individual can serve (play!) on any team, providing everyone with an opportunity to serve and play together. The following list outlines the teams and some duties. If you would like to be a part of a team please contact Lyna Kiviste or one of the Church Council members. **Please note: Some responsibilities have changed due to public health orders.**

WORSHIP

- Lectors, Acolytes, Ushers, Pulpit Supply, Communion: set up & clean up, launder & iron linens, polish silver/brass, communion bread, check supplies with Pr. Marlys to order
- Prepare Narthex: communion cards, pencils, pew clean up, post hymn numbers
- Worship folders, collection plates, candle lighting supplies, guestbook, water and glasses, children's colouring supplies, table with information, sign up sheets, cards, etc.

Special Services: Advent, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Ash Wednesday, Lent, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter, etc.

- Music: Musician, Special guests/groups

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT

- Maintenance, Rentals, Contracts, Budget, Lawns, Furnace, Roof, Gutters, Insurance

PARISH EDUCATION

- Sunday School, English as a Second Language (ESL) Bible Study, Adult Education, Vacation Bible School (VBS), Bible Studies, Confirmation, Youth Group, Christmas Tree

JOY (Outreach and Fellowship)

- Coffee, Greeters, Community, Advertising, Hospitality, Dinners, Special Events (often coordinated with LCW events), Congregational Picnic, Easter Breakfast, Soup Lunches

STEWARDSHIP

- Money, Time and Talent
