## Pastor's Musings: The "Lentiest" Lent!

During Lent 2020 the following meme circulated on Facebook:

**This is the Lentiest Lent we've ever Lented!**

As we near the end of Lent 2021, with continuing public health orders and restrictions, some are saying that Lent never ended in 2020! Those 40 days of Lent, which are to remind us of Jesus' 40-day fast in the wilderness and Moses' 40-day fast on Mount Sinai, probably feel more like the 40 **years** the Israelites wandered in the desert before reaching the Promised Land ☺

Traditionally, the 40 days of Lent (which do NOT include Sundays!) are spent in increased prayer, repentance, acts of mercy, and by giving up or fasting from things we enjoy in order to focus on Christ. Lent can seem to be a rather somber time, especially when the skies are grey and the days are short. And, as we continue to fast from time with friends and family, gathering for worship within our building, hugs and handshakes, travel, and... well, you fill in the blank! Truly, it is the Lentiest Lent I've ever Lented.

However, the word "Lent" has its roots in the Anglo-Saxon word for "spring." Some of us began our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday with planting seeds and this prayer: "Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May this soil remind us that we are fragile creatures, totally dependent on you. Remind us that apart from you we can do nothing that is good. Only by the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ we can live the abundant life you desire for all creation. We pray this through the same Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Lord. Amen."

As the days lengthen and we experience more sunshine, such physical signs increase my hope. And, the seed I planted on Ash Wednesday has actually sprouted!

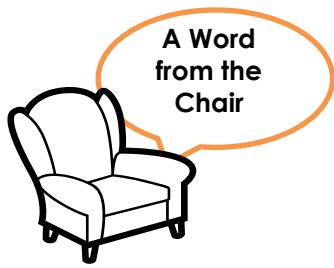


So, here's a question to ponder: where, in the midst of all that we are experiencing this Lent, are those signs of new life, new growth, and resurrection?

As we approach Holy Week, beginning March 28, we once again walk with Jesus through his agony, his suffering, and his death, perhaps more intensely than ever. Be assured that he walks with us through all that we are experiencing as well and that his promise to us remains the same. "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25)

Remember Pastor Marlys and council in your prayers as we move forward to start a new year.

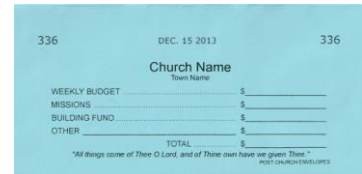

## “Joining God in the Neighbourhood” Quilt

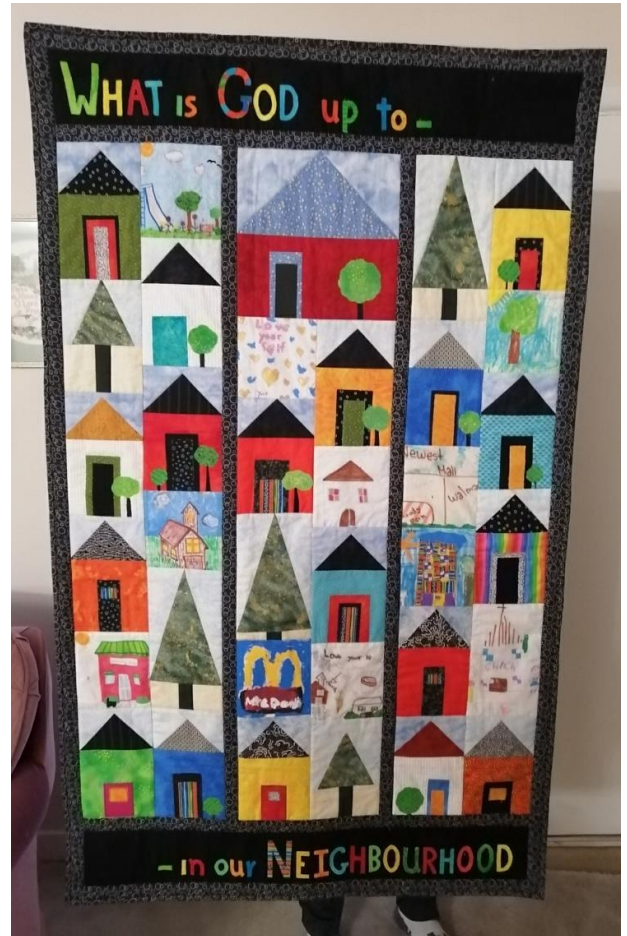
I am reminded of a song from our hymnal, #526 God is Here! The verses say, in part,

“Here, in newness and renewal, God the Spirit comes to each... Here our children find a welcome in the Shepherd's flock and fold...”

At Mount Zion the members of our Education Team are always looking for ways to encourage the children in sharing their thoughts and ideas. Early last year, while we could still meet in person, the teachers engaged them in a conversation around what Joining God in the Neighbourhood might mean. Doreen Fleury is a member of the Quilters group and a Sunday School teacher. Doreen, along with others, helped the children bring their ideas to life in a quilted banner.

The children previously completed an Alleluia banner. It is such a joy for all of us to see so many of them, big smiles on their faces, holding onto a piece of it as they, together, carry it back into worship on Easter Sunday. It is one of the ways the teachers hope to show the children that, big or small, everyone has equal value in God's dream for the world.

The *God in the Neighbourhood Quilt* displays their ideas and drawings about where God might be found in the world around them: both within the walls of our church and in the lives of the people around us, our next door neighbours, our friends and family and people in our community. The children were asked, “What are the places where we might find opportunities to be used by God, in both big and small ways?” And “What might be ways of sharing God's love in the world with others?” The Quilt drawings are their ideas of where God might be at work in people's lives and how, when we are open to this, amazing *God Moments* might be in store for us and for our neighbours.



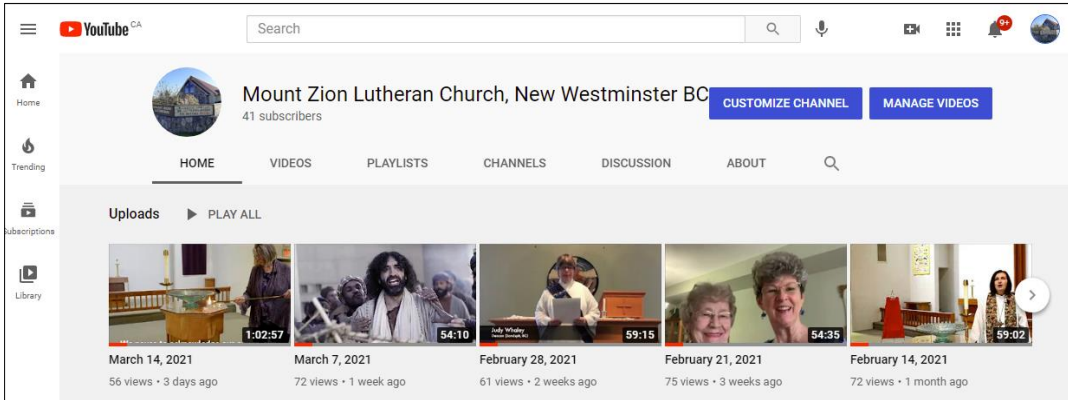

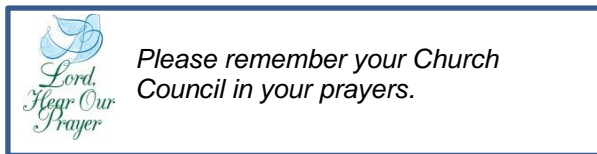

The congregation voted to maintain the current special offering designations for Easter (Seminary Support), Pentecost (Padang Relief Society), Thanksgiving (Emergency Relief Fund) & Christmas (BC Synod.)

In addition, we voted to support two more worthy causes:

1. **Greater Vancouver Food Bank:** An extra donation during Lent where funds would support a local community endeavor, the Food Bank. Check out the Greater Vancouver Food Bank website at <https://foodbank.bc.ca/> where you can donate online or you can designate the Food Bank on your offering envelope.

2. **Schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL):** We want to raise \$1,600 through individual contributions over several months, until the end of August 2021, in support of student tuition at schools of the ELCJHL. **Here is some important information from the ELCIC National Office about the situation in ELCJHL:**

As schools around the world are now into the second half of the 2020-21 academic year in very challenging circumstances, so too are the students at schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL). Earlier in the COVID-19 pandemic, the schools dealt with closures and lock down periods by embracing digital technology and distance learning. Sadly, the continued lock downs have impacted families served by the schools in many different ways. COVID-19 restrictions have meant further barricade closures and a significant loss of tourism for the region resulting in job loss and substantial reduction in income to household. Many families are now facing significant difficulties with paying tuition for the 2020-21 school year, which is on average \$1,600/year per student.

**Pre-Authorized Giving:** Several members have requested pre-authorized debiting to facilitate their giving of offerings.
